

For 2024, we once again delve into our equine heritage and we're delighted to welcome along representatives of some our wonderful native breed horses and ponies and some that are not native, but equally delightful. Many folk getting into smallholding (and many existing smallholders) enjoy having an equine or two around the place – and they can do a job of work too.

10:00am & 2:00pm – Equine parade

Providing what promises to be a genuine spectacle, our horse masters will parade their wonderful horses and ponies. With a commentary by Jackie Thoms, there's a lot to know about these native breeds, many of which are very rare.

ALPACAS

For 2024, we are delighted to be collaborating with the Scottish Alpaca Group to bring visitors an enhanced alpaca experience. Stuart Ramsay from Velvet Hall Alpacas will be making a presentation "Introduction to keeping alpacas " at 9.30am in Room 3, Foyer upper floor, than at 11.30am in the Alpaca Area of the Main Hall, Stuart will be explaining and demonstrating the finer points of alpaca fleece and how to produce it. Then at 1.30pm, there will be a practical session on alpaca health, welfare and husbandry.

There will be both Suri and Huacaya alpacas in the showcase.

This is an event not to be missed by anyone interested in these fascinating animals.

CATTLE

Our cattle showcase has been an integral part of the Festival since our first year. We aim to bring together examples of breeds most likely to be of interest to smallholders and regenerative farmers, so mainly native breeds but not always. There may be some in there you haven't seen before.

We are indebted to the owners who bring along their cattle to take part.

PIG PARADISE (IN THE CENTRAL HALL)

At Festival HQ, we know that pigs are an important part of many smallholdings, whether breeding, rearing, and processing as a business, or raising a couple of weaners for the freezer.

We are working with both the Rare Breed Survival Trust and with the British Pig Association to support their aims to protect and promote British traditional breeds of pig. All these breeds are under pressure and smallholders are in a unique and important position to help – and to produce and enjoy fantastic pork as well!

The Festival hosts the only pig show in Scotland and, under the stewardship of Alan Jamieson, our Pig Steward and the support of breeders from all over Britain, the event is going from strength to strength.

Come and read the information boards, watch in awe as the BPA qualified Judge picks the best pigs in the pig show and, of course, see the (almost) world renowned Pig Agility course, where there will be some chances for visitors to try their hand at taking pigs around an obstacle course designed to replicate some of the tricky maneuvers that pig keepers face daily on the farm.

So please do come and visit our Pig Paradise and have a chat to the keepers (and the pigs) – it's in the Central Hall through the Main Hall.
