RBST Scotland National Championships

Each livestock show at the Festival – sheep, goats, and pigs – will generate its own rare breed* Champion and these three animals will go head-to-head to compete to be the RBST Scotland National Champion.

A Champion from British rare equine breeds will qualify from a separate event.

The Champion for each of the four species will receive prize money of £25 and a rosette.

The National Champion will receive prize money of £75, a trophy and a rosette.

The Reserve National Champion will receive prize money of £50 and a rosette.

Entry fees

For classes 1-28, £12 (including VAT at 20%) for the first pig and £6 (including VAT at 20%) per pig thereafter.

There is no entry fee for classes in Section D Special Classes, but pigs entered in handling classes 30, 31, and 32 must have been shown in classes Sections A-C.

Entry fees will only be refundable in the event of the Festival being cancelled for reasons beyond the organiser's control.

Class Prizes

For classes 1-28:

1 st	2 nd	3 rd

Prize cards and rosettes will be awarded to 1st to 4th places in all classes.

Section Prizes (Sections A-C only)

- Winner: £10, prize card and rosette
- Reserve: Prize card and rosette

In addition,

- the Champion (Section A British Rare & Traditional Breeds) will receive £100, generously donated by **Sauchenhall Farm**
- the Champion (Section B Kunekune) will receive £100, generously donated by **Neil Jamieson Construction Ltd.**
- the Champion (Section C Any other breed) will receive £100, generously donated by **Sauchenhall Kunekunes**

Show Championship

- Champion: Scottish Smallholder Festival Perpetual Trophy, £25, prize card, rosette
- Reserve Champion: £15, prize card and rosette

In addition, the Show Champion will receive £100 , and the Reserve Champion, £50, generously donated by **Sauchenhall Kunekune Boar Stud**.

Special Prizes

Other perpetual prizes, trophies and any special prizes relating to a specific class are detailed with that class or in the catalogue.

Rules:

1. All classes are held under the general rules and conditions recommended by the British Pig Association and under the general rules and conditions of the Festival. You will be required to confirm that you have read and agreed to abide by them on the entry form.
2. All pigs in Sections A-C of the Schedule must be birth notified or registered with the BPA, British Lop Pig Society or BKKPS.
3. No gilt or sow may be exhibited that is in the final stage of gestation (within 15 days of the estimated due date) or within three weeks after giving birth. No piglets may be shown at less than 3 weeks old. Piglets must be shown with their sow in the relevant class only, and must be shown by the breeder.
4. With the exception of 3. above, no pig under the age of 4 months old may be shown.
5. **The Scottish Smallholder Festival strongly advises all pig keepers to observe a 20 day standstill period before and after the Festival.**
6. It is a condition of bringing pigs to the Festival that pig keepers and their supporters abide by **all biosecurity measure** in place. This includes the prevention of any nose to nose contact between animals from different holdings.
7. All boars over 12 months of age must have their tusks cut prior to arrival at the Festival.
8. Two competent adult handlers, carrying protective boards, must show all boars.
9. The use of artificial colouring, whitening and/or powder on pigs as well as the removal or addition of spots by artificial means is prohibited. The use of white wood flour is permitted.
10. Exhibitors will be provided with straw bedding for their animals from the Festival organiser. Sawdust will also be made available to exhibitors.
11. Judging will commence at 10am. Class order will be as the Schedule.

CLASSES

Section A British Rare and Traditional Breeds

Breeds that are, or have been on the RBST Watchlist: Berkshire, British Lop, British Saddleback, Gloucestershire Old Spot, Large Black, Landrace, Large White (BPA Registered), Middle White, Oxford Sandy and Black, Tamworth, Welsh.

Mangalitza are included in this Section. In the event of Mangalitza being champion or reserve champion, the animal will not go forward to the RBST Scotland National Championship. The highest placed RBST Watchlist breed goes through to the inter-species championship.

The winners of classes 1-7 will compete for Best British Rare and Traditional Pig, with the section winner and reserve progressing to compete for the Show Championship.

RBST Scotland National Championship Qualifier

The highest placed pig from a breed on the RBST Watchlist will receive a special rosette and £25 prize money and represent the pigs in the RBST Scotland National Championship.

The Winners of classes 10–16 will compete for Best Kunekune Pig, with the section winner and reserve progressing to compete for the Show Championship.

The Kunekune Champion is eligible for the BKKPS Champion of Champions 2025.

Show Championship

Winners and reserves in Sections A-C are eligible for entry.

Section D: Special Classes (No entry fee required; prizes as specified)

Prizes: Prize cards and rosettes will be awarded to 1st to 4th places.

29	Best butchers pig male or female. (Birth Notified)

The winner of Class 29 will win the James Chapman Cup.

Pig Handlers

Prizes: Prize cards and rosettes will be awarded to 1st to 4th places. All handlers will receive a rosette.

Pig Agility - Open to all exhibitors and general public

Handlers to be judged on their ability to control pigs round an obstacle course designed to mimic everyday obstacles on the farm.
